Our Youth Advisory Board has been hard at work over the past few months! Our Board has been partnered with Small House, a Boston-based nonprofit with a mission to empower transition-aged youth and young adults aged 18-24 with the tools they need to permanently and successfully transition into adulthood and independence. Small House helps youth create the kinds of lives that they want to live through goal setting and life-skill building, with plans to establish and offer transitional housing. In partnership with Boston CASA's Youth Advisory Board (YAB), YAB members were able to receive a unique, 10session unique evidence-based

Most importantly, she has learned that she has a voice, and finding others with similar experiences helps her feel less alone. She feels she can really connect with other board members. Highlight: learning it is okay to open up and speak the truth.

Jaiden says that being a part of the Youth Advisory Board is very fulfilling and that she feels like she is doing something important. Her experience with the board has been very positive so far, and she's met great people. Highlight: learning more about herself through the assignments and gaining skills to become a professional.


