#### A Message from Nicole Stewart, Boston CASA Executive Director

Dear Boston CASA Community,

Last month at our 12th Annual Transforming Lives Gala, we had an opportunity to celebrate the work of our CASAs, the children and youths they serve, and to raise funds to ensure we can continue to expand our services to the eligible children of Suffolk and Middlesex Counties. It was a wonderful evening that reflected the entirety of our community. It opened with a spectacular performance by dancers from OrigiNation Cultural Arts Center. We honored Linda Spears with the Susan J. Ganz Award, a testament to her extraordinary career-long commitment to improving policies and practices for our most vulnerable children and families. Her impact on our community has been profound. We also heard from Maria Mossaides and Judge Terry Craven, two women who have devoted their lives to protecting children. It was wonderful to have Divina speak on behalf of the youth in the room about the impact her CASA has had on her life. Her speech was a true celebration of her journey and the important role a CASA plays. It was tremendous to have members of Boston CASA's Youth Advisory Board and so many CASAs on hand to serve in the role of ambassadors. We announced the start of the Susan J. Ganz endowment thanks to the generosity of Bryan Ganz, founder of Byrna Technologies. Once again, we were blessed with videos by Nikki Cole that can be watched on our website. The evening concluded with a wonderful display

of philanthropy as community members raised their paddles and ensured the evening's success with over \$200,000 raised.

When Boston CASA became independent of the judiciary in 2012,it was with a mandate to grow the program. In 12 years, the organization has gone from serving 60 children that first year to over 300. There is still work to do with only 15% of the eligible children and youths receiving the essential support of a CASA in Suffolk and Middlesex Counties, and we need to continue to grow until we can provide a CASA to every child in need. This will require increased financial support from all sectors of our communities. The good news is that modeling shows once Boston CASA doubles its current budget, it will triple the number of children served, and we will be able to reach nearly 50% of these often-forgotten youth. Doubling our budget is only daunting if one forgets the importance of our cause.

For the past 14 months, Boston CASA has been developing a program to ensure our CASAs and staff are more responsive to transitional-aged youth in the system – those between the ages of 14-22. A recent <u>Boston Globe article</u> outlined the hardship these young people face as they transition to adulthood. The piece accentuates the challenges foster youth have navigating both the real world and the services DCF provides. This is where a CASA can make a world of difference, and why we started our Youth Advisory Board (YAB). The Youth Advisory Board serves as a platform for these young people to voice their concerns, share their experiences, and contribute to the development of our programs. By involving them directly in our work, we can ensure that our services are tailored to their needs and provide them with the support they need to thrive.

We are incredibly grateful for this community of support and partnership in our work to provide every child and youth with the life-changing opportunity of a Court Appointed Special Advocate to help them thrive. In closing is a quote from this year's youth speaker at the Gala, Divina, who is class of the 2023 YAB and currently a YAB mentor, "I don't think I would have been here if I hadn't had the mindset change that Claire [my CASA] introduced me to. The idea that things can change. That a better world is possible."
